

SpringHill Day Camp Volunteers

Except for Host Partner Counselors, all volunteer roles for the week are voluntary and unpaid. All volunteers are required to sign up on SpringHill's website; there will be no exceptions.

Host Homes

Quantity: (SpringHill Staff/3)

Role Description

A host home houses 2-5 SpringHill staff during the week of camp. They will provide dinner on Monday and Wednesday and a light breakfast throughout the week. Staff will arrive on Sunday evening before camp and will leave on Sunday or Friday following camp. Our staff have their own transportation during the summer, and host homes will not be asked for rides. If SpringHill staff are staying the weekend in a host home, the host family is not expected to entertain them, rather we encourage SpringHill staff to get out of the house and do things together on weekends.

Recruitment and Selection

Families who serve as host homes should be flexible, love to host people, and understand that our staff won't be there all the time. Below are some requirements for host homes:

- Clean house
- Bathroom and shower available
- Beds preferred, however we have air mattresses available
- Can accommodate at least 2 SpringHill staff (3 or more preferred)
- Separate rooms (staff should not share rooms with host family members)
- Within 10 miles of your site (strongly preferred)



Host Homes sign up online and will be background checked by SpringHill staff. **Christ Church will provide a discount/credit to families who become our Host Homes.** All host homes who sign up and are chosen will receive an email saying their home will be used. SpringHill will communicate names of staff, any allergies the staff may have, and when the staff will arrive directly to the Host Homes the week before camp.

Lunch Prep Volunteers

Role Description

Lunch Prep Volunteers will help each day of camp preparing food for SpringHill staff and Host Partner Volunteers for lunch at 11:45 a.m. every day. They will be in charge of preparing lunch and cleaning up each day. There are no age restrictions for this role. We need a lead person assigned to this task for the week or one person for each day to ensure all the details are addressed. Please also contact Shari Knutson if you are interested. NOTE: Friday's sponsored lunch for families and volunteers will require extra lunch prep volunteers.

Need:

- 1 lead volunteer + multiple assistants prepare each meal for the week
- Many volunteers serve the food



Staff Gathering Hosts Quantity: 2

Role Description

Staff gathering volunteers are families who are willing to open their home on Tuesday and Thursday night for SpringHill staff to gather for dinner and fun. Families will feed the SpringHill team and allow us to use their backyards or living rooms for gathering. The team will stay from 6:00 p.m. to approximately 9:00 p.m.

Many times, families serving as a host home are also excited to host the entire team for one night. Other times, someone may not be able to host for an entire week, but would still like the experience of hosting SpringHill staff. Host Partner Counselors (Camper Goal/8) x 3

This is a great opportunity for Christ Church's high school students to grow in serving at SpringHill camp.

Host Partner Counselors Receive:

- Training before camp starts
- Job skill development
- Intentional spiritual development during the week
- Growth opportunities in the future
- Pay at \$200/week

Host Partner Counselor Requirements:

- Be at least 16 years old
- Assist in leading a group of campers alongside a SpringHill Counselor
- Assist in running activities
- Provide energy, enthusiasm and encouragement to the experience
- Assist in leading games, songs, bathroom breaks, etc. throughout camp



Host Partner Counselor Application Process

- 1. Host Partner Counselor applicants will fill out the application using this link: www.springhillexperiences.com/work1week.
- 2. Host Partner Counselors will schedule an interview with someone on our team.
- 3. SpringHill will review the application, references, and background check, and schedule an interview.
- 4. If the Host Partner Counselor applicant will make a great fit, he or she will receive an offer via email! This offer must be accepted by the applicant at least one week before camp.

Counselors in Training (CITs)

Role Description

A Counselor-in-Training is an opportunity for youth too old for camp, but too young to be employed by SpringHill to train to become a future counselor. Like SpringHill Counselors, CITs build relationships with campers and work with the same group of campers for the entire week. This includes playing GWAPS (Games With A Purpose), singing songs, helping with activities, and talking with kids about what they're learning about God.

CITs are expected to attend a training on Sunday before camp and will be part of morning devotionals. CITs have a significant impact on campers, and this is a relationship that we hope can be fostered even after camp is over! We love CITs that have a lot of energy, are service-minded, and love Jesus!

Recruitment and Selection

Each CIT must be at least thirteen years of age. (There will be no exceptions to this minimum age.) CITs are between the ages of 13–15. There will be a cap on the number of CITs who can sign up at Christ Church, put in place by SpringHill.

CITs will be selected through an application process or by invitation.

CITs will sign up online and will receive communication from our staff closer to camp with details such as when to arrive on Sunday, what to bring, and generally what they can expect from this experience. Please contact Shari Knutson if your teen has interest in being a CIT as we need background checks on each student. Also, be advised that SpringHill will cap the number of CITs at camp.

Registration Volunteers

Role Description

On Monday (the first day of registration), Registration Volunteers help process registration quickly and efficiently. They will be stationed at tables and help parents and campers through the check-in process. This is an excellent opportunity to give parents and children a great first impression of Christ Church!

Role Description

Scripture reminds us that, "The battle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."
