



LOUDER WEEK 5 DEVOTIONAL

KINDNESS

RECEIVE

Slowly. Prayerfully, read out loud **HEBREWS 13:1–8**. Before and after each reading, pause for a moment of silence. In that silence pray asking the Spirit of Christ to guide you into knowing and living what you are receiving from the Scripture. Consider, what does God want you to reflect on and learn?

REFLECT

1. What is one idea from the message that captured your attention?
2. How would you define kindness?
3. What makes you decide to be kind to others?
4. Following insights from Hebrews 13, where does kindness begin? (Verse 1)
5. What are practical ways to show and demonstrate kindness? (Verses 2–4)
6. What factors can help or hinder kindness to grow? (Verses 5–8)
7. Who is our most consistent and best example of kindness? Give examples. (Hebrew 13:8 and Titus 3:4–5)
8. How would your family, friend and work relationships change if you make room for the Holy Spirit to develop practical kindness in you?

RESPOND

Using what you gleaned from above, journal five practical ways you can show kindness this coming week. Then pray asking God to give you the faith, courage and love to practice kindness.

REMEMBER

Memorize Hebrews 13:1–3

SCRIPTURE

Hebrew 13:1–8 | Living Bible (TLB)

Continue to love each other with true brotherly love. Don't forget to be kind to strangers, for some who have done this have entertained angels without realizing it! Don't forget about those in jail. Suffer with them as though you were there yourself. Share the sorrow of those being mistreated, for you know what they are going through.
