



DEAR CHURCH FAMILY



hroughout the Bible there are countless stories of God's people coming TOGETHER to further His Kingdom and LIFT others out of difficult and often dark circumstances they face.

Jesus' plan to spread the Good News included His 12 disciples, as well as so many others whom He encountered. In Ephesians we are reminded that there is one God who has redeemed us, called us sons and daughters and invited us to be bearers of His message, grace and love. The Book of Nehemiah gives us an example of God's people coming TOGETHER to rebuild the Wall of Jerusalem—bringing hope to His people.

This same model of togetherness is what established this church in 1965 when a handful of faithful families made sacrificial gifts to build the church at the corner of 31st and York. Over the years this congregation has LIFTed others using their finances, time and gifts to expand the Oak Brook campus; launch the Butterfield campus; and support ministry and missions that have changed lives over the last five decades.

When we embarked on the LIFT journey a year ago, we had a goal in our strategic plan to **LIFT 10,000 people** by the end of 2024.

I remain in awe of what God has done. Hundreds of people have committed to raise their own faith and discipleship and we are seeing ministry offerings overflowing with people walking alongside one another and learning more about God.



We are now at the half-way point of this two-year discipleship journey, and we are excited by all God has done and eagerly anticipate what's to come.

Over the next four weeks I hope we will all be inspired, encouraged and challenged as we seek to refresh our vision and commitment to LIFT through our series TOGETHER. As we participate in worship, listen and share stories and engage with the study in the pages that follow, I believe we will be LIFTed by how the Holy Spirit is moving in and among us. Our faith will continue to grow and we will become a more loving and generous people.

Through the stories we will share in worship and the details in the following pages, I think you will be LIFTed by what we have seen happen over this past year as we have been stretching and growing in our faith and stewardship of our finances and serving.

None of us has it all together, but TOGETHER with Christ we have all the gifts we need to LIFT those He has placed in our path.



We project the need for modest budget increases year-over-year.



- Each week more than 3,000 people participated in one of two expressions of worship across two campuses and online
- Our new men's gathering, Third Thursday Eats has been attracting **70+ men** each month. They build and deepen relationships and their faith over a great meal, football, games, Bible study and stories
- In the fall, 411 women from Christ Church and churches in our surrounding neighborhoods gathered at Women of Hope to study the Book of Acts
- 23 men and women are serving as Stephen Ministers-coming alongside to offer support and counsel to those journeying through a difficult season of life

Since its founding, the people of Christ Church have had a passion to LIFT others and go into all the world to spread the Good News of the Gospel. Over the past 25 years our congregation has sent almost **\$40M** to multiply disciples and churches, lift women and children, transform communities, relieve suffering, and develop leaders in partnership with more than 70 mission groups locally and globally.

We seek to raise our annual missions giving through LIFT and invest an additional \$500,000 in a facility to house the Food Pantry and support other needs in the surrounding communities.



More than 700 stepped forward to give of their time and talent to LIFT others during FOR Chicagoland in October 2023

- 21 people stepped outside their comfort zones to serve on Global Outreach (GO) trips to Dominican Republic, Malawi and Romania in 2023
- We sent tens of thousands of dollars in disaster relief to Turkey, India, Malawi, Hawaii and Morocco to help LIFT others dealing with the devastation from fires, floods and earthquakes
- **1,000+ gifts** were given FOR Christmas as we asked the congregation to stretch their giving beyond the church in new ways, fulfilling specific wishes for children and supporting many of our mission partners—spreading His love and joy over the holiday season and into the new year
- More than 100 families were provided food and clothing each month at the Christ Church Food Pantry



KIDS & **FAMILIES**

\$3M

We strive to be a highly attractive and resourceful environment for families.



We have a desire to strengthen our ministry to children, students and families and help them grow and build a strong and lasting foundation of faith.

We are moving forward with renovations that will give third graders more centrally located rooms. We seek to provide an expanded center for fourth and fifth graders. And, we look to give middle and high schoolers a significantly upgraded environment for small group huddles and large group gatherings. This space will also be used for some adult ministry activities and events.

- To improve security and navigation we have constructed a corridor connecting the Discovery Center to the preschool classrooms—this has created a single point of entry for our children's and student ministry areas
- Danielle Schaeffer (bottom of page 11, right) was hired as Disabilities Ministry Director to help resource our kids, parents, staff and volunteers—she is helping plan for new sensory rooms, is building a buddy system to support children and families with disabilities and has helped add headphones in services for those with sensitivity to sound









Preschool Director Kelly Newton (below, left) has been working to re-launch the preschool program for the 2024-25 school year including researching curriculum, going through DCFS certification, and preparing to interview and hire teachers

• 947 children and students ages 4 to 18 grew in their discipleship through camps last summer

- 21 leaders led 72 students on mission trips last summer to serve those experiencing homelessness, build homes and support mission programs in Nashville, Chicago and Baja, Mexico
- The new Young Families group continues to grow—58 families have gathered for large group events and 25 families have connected in small groups





CAMPUS QUALITY

Address deferred maintenance, tech and infrastructure needs at both campuses.

Throughout 2023 we made improvements to both of our campuses. As good stewards of what God has provided we want to care for and maintain our facilities to ensure they are vital and available for years to come.

Oak Brook Projects

- Renew fully-aged tech systems in the Sanctuary, Garden Chapel, Fellowship Hall and Discovery Center
- Replace steeple windows to fix leaks in the Sanctuary
- Resurface the parking lot and designate spaces with signage for new visitors and parents on their own with young children
- Update aged kitchen equipment
- Replace carpeting and repaint rooms

Butterfield Projects

- Improve tech systems and update seating in the worship space
- Improve the gymnasium lighting, heating and flooring
- Resurface the parking lot and designate spaces with signage for new visitors and parents on their own with young children
- Service mechanical systems





We believe being good stewards of what we have been given includes good debt management.

In 2023 we paid that down from \$8M to \$7.5M—a conservative level by American church standards.

Through LIFT we hope to pay off more, thereby freeing up resources for ministry.

FUTURE CAPACITY

By reducing our debt we will free up resources for more ministry aimed at God's purposes.

WHAT WE ASK OF YOU

- INSPIRE | Whether you are new to Christ Church or you have called this place home for years, we hope you will feel INSPIRED to join us on this journey to LIFT our faith and discipleship by making a 12-month giving commitment to LIFT.
- **ENCOURAGE** | For those who made a commitment a year ago, we want to continue to feed and nourish your soul. We know for some this journey has been challenging, possibly more than you imagined. Maybe you stretched to a new level of giving and are still adjusting. Maybe you have been impacted by a job loss or change, medical expenses or other economic challenges. We are here to walk alongside of you, offering prayer, encouragement and counsel. We pray that you find strength in Jehovah Jireh—the God who provides and that we can ENCOURAGE you as you engage in the life at Christ Church.
- CHALLENGE | Some of us made a commitment to LIFT one year ago and have experienced an increase in faith or finances. Keeping a commitment hasn't been easy because it has likely required sacrifice. But, you may be sensing the Lord stretching you to take another step of faith in your giving. We CHALLENGE you to pay attention to His prompting and increase your commitment. Our generosity journey is ever evolving—Our Father is always growing and shaping us. Generosity is not a one and done, but a continuous journey. Consider asking yourself: Am I still giving in a way that challenges me? Am I still LIFTing my own faith and discipleship? Pray and ask if He is inviting you into another step of faith with an increased commitment to LIFT.

Throughout 2023 we have seen and experienced God on the move in us and through us! He continues to LIFT each of us in our relationship with Him so that we can be His hands and feet to our community, our world and future generations. He has given us every reason to trust Him, knowing He is a Good Father who gives us good gifts. May we respond to His goodness and truth with our whole lives.

- A few times this week, take five minutes to sit TOGETHER with God in silence with this request: God how may I demonstrate my trust in You through the spiritual practice of tithing? Each time after praying this, journal God's response or your thoughts and feelings.
- Take active, faith-filled steps this year to grow in the spiritual practice of tithing. Or, if you are already doing so, move beyond the "tenth."

What are you asking me to do in this initiative?

First and foremost, we are asking that you pray and seek God's leading on what He is asking of you. Prepare your heart to hear Him, and then listen to what He says. Join a small group. Talk with a trusted friend or, if you're married and have children, talk together about what this commitment will mean for this next season. We are asking that you make a sacrificial commitment so we can LIFT others through our generosity.

How long is my commitment?

LIFT is a two-year initiative. The fulfillment period is January 1, 2023-December 31, 2024. At this halfway point we are encouraging people who made a commitment a year ago to persevere and finish strong in the journey.
